Congratulations Research and Innovation

Our Research and Innovation Oncology team has been awarded Global Clinical Site Accredication (GCSA) Accreditation for demonstrating global best practice standards in patient engagement after a year long evaluation.

This internationally recognised accreditation illustrates that we can deliver successful and high quality clinical research to an industry-defined best practice standard.

This successful accreditation has provided us with a thorough understanding of our research pathways and where we need to improve. It also clearly signals that we care about quality and can be the clinical partner of choice for research locally, nationally and internationally.



NHS Covid & flu vaccines brought forward

Due to the recent detection of a new highly transmittable Covid variant, you may have heard that NHS England has brought forward its seasonal Covid and flu vaccine programmes.

The adult covid and flu vaccinations had been due to start in October to maximise protection over the winter months, but now those most at risk including adult care home residents are already being given their Covid vaccines.

This is a pre-emptive change to provide vulnerable people with the strongest possible protection from risks presented by the new Covid BA.2.86 variant. Here at the Royal

Berkshire Foundation Trust, we've already been seeing a weekly rise in inpatients with Covid for the last few months.

From 18 September, the NHS will start to invite people in priority order of risk and those eligible will be able to book an appointment through the NHS National Booking Service.



Flu vaccine

The most common flu symptoms are fever, chills, headache, aches and pains in the joints and muscles, and extreme tiredness. Although healthy people usually recover fully, for some frail or clinically vulnerable people, flu can be more serious and lead to hospitalisation.

Flu vaccines help protect against the main types of flu virus circulating and it's best to have your flu vaccination in the autumn or early winter before flu rates increase. Remember that you need it every year, so don't assume you are protected because you had one last year.

Royal Berkshire's new Rapid Response Lab

Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust's (RBFT) Pathology team has this month moved to their new state-of-the-art Rapid Response Lab at the Royal Berkshire Hospital, enabling them to provide a faster, more reliable pathology testing service for patients. This will bring efficiencies for patients who are undergoing laboratory analysis for Biochemistry, Haematology and Blood Transfusion tests.



The new lab is located in a large open plan space with better workflow, allowing them to work together more efficiently.

It's a big improvement on the cramped and cluttered area the Pathology team previously worked in.

The long-awaited opening of this modern rapid response lab is the culmination of a multi-million pound investment for RBFT Pathology, and the result of months of planning, collaboration, building works, installations and testing. As part of the move to new premises, the new lab is kitted out with new analytical equipment, replacing the old unreliable equipment the team were using.

Dom Hardy, RBFT Chief Operating Officer commented: "I'm really proud that we've delivered this large and challenging project to plan and on time. It will provide a more reliable service for teams in the hospital and ultimately for patients. It's a testament to

our staff that they've been delivering a great service for so long – in spite of the unreliable equipment they were using, in a cramped and crowded space. The new lab has really improved working conditions for the team, allowing them to work more collaboratively and efficiently, and improve their wellbeing."
