'One-stop' clinic bringing relief to arthritis sufferers

The Trauma and Orthopaedics team at the trust have launched a 'one-stop' clinic to help patients suffering with the pain of osteoarthritis in their hands and wrists.

The team see hundreds of people in the Outpatients department each month. A quarter of all GP referrals to the team are for patients with arthritis, which is often part of the wear and tear of getting older and can be difficult to live with.



Thanks to a new x-ray machine - a mini c-arm - clinicians can now image the hand and wrist themselves in the clinic.

Before this clinic, it could take more than a year from GP referral, to first appointment, to xray, and then on to treatment in our radiology department or in an operating theatre. This new clinic streamlines the experience, reducing the wait for treatment by months, and also easing the pressure on the hospital's other departments.

This means a patient can get seen, assessed, diagnosed, and treated with a steroid injection in a single first visit to the hospital. And they can also see the images pop up on the screen in real-time, helping them to understand their condition and the treatment they are having.

Natasha Picardo, Trauma and Orthopaedic Consultant said, "We hope this clinic will make a big difference to patients who have arthritis in the hands and wrists. Living with pain is exhausting, and makes normal life difficult. To be able to see patients just once, within weeks of an initial referral, means they can receive treatment and get on with their lives much more quickly.

Infection Prevention Society's Impact Award winners

Well done to our Vascular Access Improvement Group, recently announced as joint gold winners in the Infection Prevention Society's 2023 Impact Awards. The awards recognise organisations who are putting patients at the centre of infection prevention and control practice.



The team won the Patient Experience award for their project to improve the quality of care and reduce the risk of infection associated with vascular access devices.

Dedicated couple remembered with memorial bench

Family, friends and staff from the Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust came together recently to remember local husband and wife, Brenda and Ralph Jenkins and their incredible fundraising efforts. The couple, who passed away last year, were long-term supporters of Macmillan Cancer, raising funds and supporting people living with cancer for more than three decades.

Brenda and Ralph's children Philip and Rachel, along with members of the Central Berkshire Macmillan fundraising group gathered to dedicate a bench in their memory. It sits within a private courtyard garden in the Royal Berkshire Hospital's Berkshire Cancer Centre, providing a secluded outdoor space for patients and their families. It's a place to regroup mentally and physically away from the hospital environment during visits.



Philip Jenkins said, "It was great to meet some of the team at The Berkshire Cancer Centre and have the opportunity to look around the facility to better understand how the money Mum and Dad helped raise over many, many years has helped cancer sufferers in Berkshire. We are very grateful to Macmillan for the gesture of the bench in memory of Mum and Dad and hope patients and visitors will be able to enjoy sitting out in the courtyard."

Mark Foulkes, Nurse Consultant at the Berkshire Cancer Centre said, "It was a real privilege to meet Philp and Rachel, and to hear more about the tireless fundraising their parents did for so many years. We have a Macmillan Information Centre here at the hospital, which really benefits from funds raised by people like Mr and Mrs Jenkins.

"It means we can support our patients with grants for the practical costs that come with living with cancer, for example energy bills and furniture modifications. Our patients find real comfort in the peace of the little garden. The memorial bench will most certainly add to the space while also marking Brenda and Ralph's remarkable dedication."
