

# Using your prosthesis

#### This leaflet explains how to position your maxillofacial prosthesis.

## About your prosthesis

Each patient is individual and we endeavour to provide holistic care, as we know everyone's needs are different.

The prosthesis is constructed from silicon or a mixture of silicone and acrylic.

Making a prosthesis takes approximately four visits. An impression of the site is needed and colour matching is also required.

#### Positioning the prosthesis

- 1. Stand or sit in front of a mirror.
- 2. Practice placing the prosthesis in the correct position. Ensure contact area of the prosthesis is clean.
- 3. The prosthesis is held in place by a special medical skin adhesive. The particular adhesive used will depend on the patient's individual requirements.
- 4. Apply a layer of the adhesive around the edges of the prosthesis; adhesive can be used on other areas of the prosthesis if it contacts with the skin and if it is thought necessary for better retention.
- 5. The prosthesis should be removed and cleaned before going to bed. If a cleaning agent is needed it will be supplied with the prosthesis; verbal instructions will also be given. When not in use the prosthesis should be stored in a suitable container in a safe place and out of sunlight.
- 6. The prosthesis and skin should be cleaned before the prosthesis is re-attached.
- 7. Verbal care instructions will also be given when the prosthesis is provided.
