This leaflet aims to answer some of the questions you may have about the role of the clinical nurse specialist for motor neurone disease (MND).

# What does the clinical nurse specialist (CNS) do?

- Can offer clinical expertise, support and information about motor neurone disease.
- Liaises with other health professionals and make referrals to help manage your condition.
- Is in contact with the neurologists and neuro rehabilitation consultants to discuss your care.
- Can review you in clinic, by video consultation, telephone, and if required at home.

## Your multidisciplinary team

There are many health professionals and services that may be involved in your care to help maximise your independence, dignity and quality of life. These include: community nurses, dietitians, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, palliative care, respiratory services, social services and speech and language therapists. The CNS works closely with these services and will take the lead to coordinate your care.

# What can the clinical nurse specialist offer you?

- Information about your illness.
- Advice and support for you, your relatives, carers and friends.
- Advice on your continued care at home.
- Help with physical symptoms such as breathlessness, fatigue or nausea.
- Refer you to other services that may be able to help you, such as occupational therapy, physiotherapy, speech and language therapy, respiratory services, dietitians and the wheelchair clinic.

- Advice and support when making decisions about specific interventions.
- Advanced Care Planning.
- Signposting to services that can help you to apply for benefits.
