



PEG tube removal by manual traction aftercare advice

This leaflet gives you advice following the removal of your PEG tube using manual traction.

After removal of your PEG tube

Today you have had your PEG tube removed. A cut was made down the length of the tube, releasing air from the air-filled button / bumper. The tube was then pulled out using manual traction. You are unlikely to have any serious side effects but please be aware of the following:

- The site might feel a bit sore
- You may have some bleeding

What to look out for

Serious side effects from this procedure are rare; however, look out for:

- Excessive bleeding
- Infection (oozing, redness or soreness, high temperature)

If you experience any of the above, please contact your GP immediately, informing them that you have had your PEG tube removed.

Other advice

- No shower for 48 hours / no bath for 72 hours.
- Keep your dressing on for 24 hours. After 24 hours, remove the dressing. If the site is dry, do not re-dress. If site is bleeding or oozing, re-dress with the gauze and tape we provided.
- You can start eating and drinking two hours after the procedure.
