Managing your pain after an operation

Adult Day Surgery Unit

You should have been given an aftercare leaflet specific to the operation you have had. This leaflet is designed to provide you with information about treating your pain after your operation on the Adult Day Surgery Unit (ADSU).

We recommended you to take simple painkillers such as paracetamol and ibuprofen after your operation; if you require stronger painkillers you will have been supplied with some, such as codeine phosphate, before you left the unit to go home.

It is important to follow the recommended dosing instructions of all medicines. This section records when you took your last doses on the ADSU, and when it is safe for you to take your next dose/s:

Recommended doses:

Pain relief medication	Individual dose	How often?	Maximum allowed in 24 hours
Paracetamol	1g (2 x 500mg tablets)	Every 4-6 hours	4g (8 tablets)
Ibuprofen	400mg (2 x 200mg tablets)	Every 8 hours	1.2g (6 tablets)
Paracetamol and ibuprofen can be taken together.			
Codeine phosphate	30-60mg (1-2 tablets)	Every 4-6 hours	240mg (8 tablets)

We recommend that you read the patient information leaflet inside each medication box.

Only take painkillers that have been prescribed for **you**.

If these painkillers do not control your pain adequately we recommend you go to see your GP for a review and further treatment.

During the first 24 hours following your discharge

After 24 hours, please seek advice from your GP or call NHS 111.
